

Draft Standard Operating Procedure

Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001

For effective management of the waste the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India has notified the Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 under the Environment (Protection) Act 1986 with the prime objective of channelizing the used lead-acid batteries for environmentally sound recycling.

According to the Rules, every dealer of the lead acid battery shall be required to make an application to the State Pollution Control Board and obtain registration from the State Pollution Control Board. The dealer of the batteries shall get registered with the State Pollution Control Board for five years.

B. Check List for renewal of registration under Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 as amended in 2010.

1. The renewal of the registration shall be as per the compliance status of the dealer.
2. Completely filled Form-IV (Form for registration of dealers) under Batteries (Management and Handling) Rules, 2001 as amended in 2010.
3. Copy of TIN/VAT/GST No.
4. Filled Form-V (form for filing returns of sale of new batteries and collection of old batteries).
